The mini city behind us, too small for the internal block on which it is being built, has disrupted the peace of our neighbourhood with trucks and cranes for all this time, almost daily from about 7am. Imagine being subjected to this constant daily noise for this length of time. All supplies for this enormous construction project are trucked and manhandled in from the single exit lane beside us since there is no turning space left on the block itself and none of the buildings being constructed have street frontage.

Thanks to the many leniencies doled out by Hobart City Council, the neighbours are now overshadowed, overlooked, had push backs on boundaries and are subjected all these months to constant building noises from morning to night.

The overuse of the single muddy exit laneway has led to road degradation, requiring cleanings by council. The traffic
