ANYONE who doubts Anne Harrison's comments that planning laws are leading to a culture of destructive rather than better decisions (Talking Point, October 28) need only walk along the rivulet in Lipscombe Reserve: Cram in multiple units, get rid of the soil, trees and garden. Blow the stormwater problems, the council can sort that out and pay for it. In the process of building above the reserve, soil, rocks, logs and tangled vegetation slipped from the site to dam the rivulet and impede water flow. These planning changes allow unrestrained developments while minimising opportunities for community response. Will the public watch helplessly as their rights are reduced? I think not.
